With the Nov. 6 election one month away it is vital all Wisconsinites have an up-to-date voter registration, as well as a valid [proof of residence](#) whether voting by mail, in-person at the clerk's office, or at the polls on Election Day. Below are deadlines and resources to help insure you do not miss your opportunity to have your voice heard:

Voter Registration - Deadlines for the Nov. 6, 2018 General Election

Date	Deadline	Description
October 17, 2018	Deadline to register by mail .	Your voter registration form, along with proof of residence must be postmarked to your municipal clerk no later than Oct. 17, 2018. Find your municipal clerk's contact information here.
October 17, 2018	Deadline to register to vote online .	Voters, who are able to match their name, date of birth, Wisconsin Driver License or State ID number, and address with the Wisconsin DMV can register to vote online through Oct. 17, 2018.

<p>November 2, 2018 5:00 p.m.</p>	<p>Deadline to register in your municipal clerk's office.</p>	<p>Voters may register in-person in their municipal clerk's office during the clerk's business hours until 5:00 p.m. on Nov. 2, 2018. Find your municipal clerk's contact information here.</p>
<p>November 6, 2018 7:00 a.m. - 8:00 p.m.</p>	<p>Register to vote at your polling place.</p>	<p>Voters can register to vote at their polling place on Election Day, Nov. 6, 2018. You can find your polling place here. Remember that you need to bring a photo ID.</p>

Absentee Voting - Deadlines for the Nov. 6, 2018 General Election

Date	Deadline	Description
<p>November 1, 2018 5:00 p.m.</p>	<p>Deadline to request an absentee ballot by mail - regular and permanent overseas voters.</p>	<p>If you are a regular or a permanent overseas voter your absentee ballot request must be received by your municipal clerk no later than 5:00 p.m. on Nov. 1, 2018.</p>
<p>November 2, 2018 5:00 p.m.</p>	<p>Deadline to request an absentee ballot- indefinitely confined and military.</p>	<p>If you are indefinitely confined or in the military, your absentee ballot request must be received by your municipal clerk no later than 5:00 p.m. on Nov. 2, 2018.</p>
<p>November 4, 2018</p>	<p>Deadline for in-person absentee.</p>	<p>Voters can request and vote by absentee ballot in-person in their municipal clerk's office through Nov. 4, 2018. Office hours vary by municipality. Some municipal offices may not offer additional in-person absentee hours. Please contact your municipal clerk for absentee voting hours.</p>
<p>November 6, 2018 5:00 PM</p>	<p>Deadline for hospitalized voters.</p>	<p>Voters who are in a hospital may request a ballot be brought to them by an appointed agent if they are hospitalized in the 7 days preceding the election. Hospitalized electors may request an absentee ballot between Oct. 31, 2018 and Nov. 6, 2018 at 5:00 p.m.</p>

<p>November 6, 2018 8:00 p.m.</p>	<p>Deadline to return absentee ballot.</p>	<p>If you have already received an absentee ballot, you must return your absentee ballot by mail or delivery to your <u>municipal clerk</u>. Your ballot must be received by your municipal clerk no later than 8:00 p.m. on Election Day, Nov. 6, 2018.</p>
